

SKills for long-term unemploYed

The SKills for long-term unemployed - SKY project is funded by the Erasmus+ programme: Cooperation partnerships in the fields of education, training - European NGOs.

The experimentation " Territories Zero Long-Term Unemployed " launched in France in 2017 aiming to fight against long-term unemployment at the scale of a territory underlines that many long-term unemployed (LTU) do not feel able to follow long training pathways leading to qualifications but wish to be integrated in and through work as quickly as possible.

The SKY project proposes to experiment with the implementation of micro-training courses enabling LTU's to get out of the blocked situation in which they find themselves in order to acquire professional skills that meet the needs of the companies in a given territory.

The objectives of the project are:

- 1.To enable LTU to acquire valuable skills by setting up short training courses in order to reintegrate them socially and professionally and to give them the desire to learn to learn.
- 2.To offer a complementary tool (micro-training and microcertification partnerships) to the organisations in charge of training and supporting LTU.
