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	<p>micro-training and micro-certifications structured around two territories, in this case the Roissy Pays de France conurbation on the one hand and the Cergy-Pontoise conurbation on the other.</p> <p>The challenge for the French and European partners was to exchange views on this original organisation and on the working method put in place to detect the professional skills identified in relation to the selected professions, on the public and private sectors, and on the role of the European Commission.</p> <p>"We are also looking at the method for measuring the 'delta' at entry to the micro-training courses".</p>

<p>Summary of the event including what worked well</p>	<p>The event enabled the partners to discover the extent of the partnership needed to make the</p>



	<p>SKY project a success, and the original processes put in place by the AGFE, in particular the three "micro-training" project groups organised around <u>a trio of</u> employer and employee, support structure and training organisation. They also discovered that the selection of the public for the micro-training courses would be juxtaposed with the entry/exit circuits of the Local Integration and Employment Plans of Cergy-Pontoise and Roissy Pays de France, to ensure that they specifically targeted a public at risk of long-term exclusion from the labour market.</p>
<p>Summary of participants' feedback</p>	<p>The partners gave positive feedback on the progress of the project. They did, however, suggest that the design of the micro-training courses should depart from the certification processes used in traditional training leading to qualifications.</p>
